Summer of Love

DESCRIPTION 1967, the year of the "Summer of Love." It began in January when thousands of flower children pressed en masse into San Francisco's Golden Gate Park for a Human Be-in, one of those "happenings" that was supposed to be. Music was provided by the Grateful Dead and the Jefferson Airplane, which its first album featuring the compelling voice of Grace Slick. It was also the year that Ronnie Wood co-founded the Jeff Beck Group with Rod Stewart on vocals. Jimi Henrix released his first album, and The Beatles, their eighth, Sgt. Pepper. It was also the year of the Monterey Pop Festival where Janis Joplin made her first major public appearance.

Fifty years later, memories of 1967 are about to be rekindled in *Visions of Music*, an exhibition at **Jack Gallery** featuring the art work of Hendrix, Wood, and Slick, as well as Stanley Mouse, "the man who drew the face on rock 'n' roll"; and Sebastian Kruger, whose expressive celebrity portraits looked out from the pages of *Rolling Stone*. The show, which runs through Aug 31, opens Friday, 5 to 8 at 678 N Wells.
